COMMUNITY RESOURCE GUIDE

We realize at Research Medical Center that any visit to the Emergency Department can be a stressful event. In order to address the overcrowding we are experiencing in our emergency departments, the hospital has set forth a process to provide medical care and treatment to patients who come to the Emergency Department with and without emergency medical conditions.

Early in your visit to the Emergency Department you will meet with a triage nurse. The triage nurse will ask you questions about your health problems or that of your family member. At that time, your vital signs, such as temperature, pulse and blood pressure may be taken. The triage nurse's responsibility is to set priorities for patient care in the Emergency Department. This means the triage nurse will screen patients based on the nature and extent of a patient's injury or illness in order to refer them to the ED physician or other qualified medical person.

In general, there are three different categories that patients are prioritized as:

1. Immediate or Emergent - Life and Death

Examples include airway and breathing problems, cardiac arrest (heart stopped), chest pain and multiple injuries.

2. Urgent

Examples include burns, moderate pain and broken bones.

3. Non-Emergent or Non-urgent

Examples include cold/flu, minor sprain/strains, minor cuts and abrasions, and dental pain.

What qualifies as emergency medical assistance?

Clients must have a pressing need for emergency medical assistance, one time per year. The program does NOT cover Medicare/Medicaid co-pays, emergency room visits, pre-existing medical expenses, routine doctor's visits and hospitalization.

Who qualifies?

Income guideline for each household is 200% of federal poverty level.

- -Example: Single person with income less than \$1,805/month.
- -Applicants must provide: Picture ID's, Social Security cards, proof of income for everyone in household and proof of address for past 30 days.
